



# Welcome to the Curran Apple Orchard Park!

<u>History</u>: Mary and Charles Curran purchased a 7.33 acre parcel of land in 1951 and transformed it into an apple orchard with 250 Gravenstein, MacIntosh and Golden Delicious apple trees. In 1993, the University Place Community Council successfully obtained Conservation Futures funds from Pierce County to preserve the orchard forever as a park. Today, volunteers work with the City of University Place in maintaining the orchard as an "urban, edible" outdoor classroom.

Pruning Adoptions: (\$50 available January through March 31)

Adopter requirements: Pruning, thinning, weeding, harvesting and windfall clean up. (Approximately 4-6 visits per year). Free pruning instruction is available.
